THE SEDUCTION OF FAMOUS ITALIAN DESIGNERS ELEGANZA – ITALIAN FASHION FROM 1945 TO TODAY HAS ATTRACTED THE RECORD NUMBER OF 85 000 VISITORS TO THE MCCORD MUSEUM

Montreal, September 26, 2016 – Organized by the Victoria and Albert Museum of London and presented by Holt Renfrew, the exhibition *Eleganza: Italian Fashion From 1945 to Today* closed yesterday. An exclusive Canadian venue, it has attracted 85 000 visitors, which places it as the first top ranking exhibit presented by the McCord Museum. *Eleganza* had already attracted 300,000 visitors in London and in the United Sates. Both the public and media praised the exhibition and the McCord Museum was happy to give people the opportunity to discover up close these creations by celebrated designers. With this event, the McCord Museum has established itself as the fashion museum of Montreal.

After the presentation, in 2015 of *Horst: Photographer of Style*, this is second collaboration between the McCord Museum and the prestigious Victoria and Albert Museum, which owns, among its vast array of collections, the largest collection of clothes dating from the 16th to the 20th centuries in Great Britain. The McCord Museum owns what is considered the leading collection of Canadian dress and the second most important collection of costume in Canada. Its Costume and Textiles collection has grown since 1957 and contains, among other pieces, about 18,900 items of dress and accessories, with several key pieces created by some of Montreal's greatest 20th-century designers, as well as prominent Canadian and European *grands couturiers*. Such a collection reinforces the important place of Montreal in the fashion industry in Canada.
