■ Children's Birthday Parties (additional fees)

Three party themes are offered:

TOTEM: Find the animals hidden on the giant Haida totem pole, which has many secrets to reveal. In a creative workshop, children fashion a totem pole of their own family out of clay.

SEARCH FOR THE LOST TALISMAN: Set out on a treasure hunt through the Museum's collections to find the good-luck charm. In a creative workshop, children make their own talisman.

ISLAND OF TOYS, from November 18 to April 19: Search through a magical forest full of amazing characters to find crew members who've gone missing on an island full of toys. In a workshop, children make a character inspired by the exhibition's theme.
