The Museum offers two applications accessible to all for the Montreal tourist season and upcoming school year

Montreal, July 11, 2012 - The McCord Museum is pleased to announce the return of MTL Urban Museum (MUM) and iMontreal, two ground-breaking, state-of-the-art applications. Part of the Museum's outreach program, the applications, which have been made possible by TELUS, bring the McCord Museum collections to the streets and classrooms, plunging Montrealers and Montreal tourists alike into the past and providing them with a novel and entertaining way to experience history.

MTL Urban Museum: time travel has arrived!

Free to download to the iPhone, the MTL Urban Museum application offers a unique opportunity to relive the history of such iconic Montreal landmarks as St. Catherine Street, Sherbrooke Street, Old Montreal, Mount Royal Park, and the McGill University campus. The application, launched in September 2011 in collaboration with TELUS and Historia, uses augmented reality technology to allow users to explore the city's past by revisiting the very places where its history was created. Some 150 photographs from the McCord Museum's Notman Photographic Archives transport the visitor to the Montreal of yesteryear while providing a new take on the city. Large round stickers on the ground enable users to easily identify some of the 150 sites featured in the application.

Since last year, this McCord Museum application has surprised and delighted techsavvy visitors. The application's success is also largely due to TELUS, which, as a believer in the future of innovation, has contributed significantly in sponsoring the initiative. "We are very grateful to TELUS for this partnership, which enables visitors to discover the city and its stories from their mobile phone while tapping into the latest technology," stated Suzanne Sauvage, President and Chief Executive Officer of the McCord Museum.

iMontreal application arrives at school

Since elementary and high school students are so familiar with this type of technology, the *iMontreal* application on Museum iPods adds to the dynamism of the visit and makes it easier for youth to learn about history.
