SIXTH EDITION OF THE McCORD MUSEUM'S URBAN FOREST: AN OASIS OF PEACE IN DOWNTOWN MONTREAL!

Montreal, May 25, 2016 – Until October 2, 2016, the McCord Museum will present its *Urban Forest*, nestled in the heart of Montreal, for the sixth consecutive year. For more than four months, Victoria Street between Sherbrooke West and Président-Kennedy will become a colourful pedestrian haven. Once again this year, the Museum has entrusted WANTED Paysage with the creation of this downtown destination popular for relaxation and discovery. The area will be awash in bright reds, oranges and pinks, reminiscent of the most breathtaking sunsets. Back are the site's outdoor furnishings and public piano, not to mention the delicious offerings of the food trucks that pull up at noon. The *Urban Forest* is definitely worth a daily visit. Its rich and varied program will also entertain passers-by all summer long free of charge, and its flower-lined Café Bistro terrace on Sherbrooke Street will serve up a light and fresh lunch menu from Monday to Friday.

It's the ideal place to end a visit to the Museum or simply take a refreshing break while downtown.
