ILLUSIONS: THE ART OF MAGIC 120 MINUTES UNTIL JANUARY 7, 2018

This exhibition of magic show posters offers students an introduction to the golden age of magic (1880-1930) in North America. The promotional posters illustrate the outstanding results of the chromolithography technique and represent the artistic trends of the time. Young visitors also become familiar with the great illusions made possible by science.



In a workshop, students learn a technique similar to chromolithography and create a poster.

### **UPSIDE DOWN TALES** 120 MINUTES NOVEMBER 19, 2017 TO MARCH 12, 2018

Our favourite fairy tales are revisited this year. A spell cast by the evil fairy Carabosse has left the tales all mixed up with characters and storytelling objects in the wrong stories. Young visitors must ward off the spell and put the stories back in order. This magical world features vintage toys, decorative art objects and mysterious books from an enchanted library.

#### ANOTHER PERSPECTIVE ON THE WORLD

#### 120 MINUTES

In our age of social networks and instantaneity, it's time to stand back and look at the place of photography in our lives. From daguerreotypes to digital images, the Museum's collection offers a journey through time with more than 1.3 million photographs documenting the social history of Montreal, Quebec and Canada. Over the course of the year, this journey will be enhanced by works of contemporary photographers.

#### September 6 to November 12, 2017:

Jayce Salloum presents an installation that explores themes of disputed territories, nationalism, social inclusion, and identity crises.

### December 7, 2017, to April 8, 2018:

Gabor Szilasi, one of Quebec's most renowned photographers, presents his vision of exhibition openings and social life in the art world.

#### February 16 to May 6, 2018:

Michel Campeau takes a look at the golden age of amateur photography (1950 to 1960). Everyone can relate to his themes: family, friendship, consumption and happiness.

#### May 4, 2018, to January 6, 2019:

Marisa Portolese uses staged settings to explore portraiture and such complex themes as adolescence.



### THE RHYTHMS OF FIRST PEOPLES 120 MINUTES

The cultures and traditional knowledge of First Peoples have been passed from one generation to the next and are still alive today. Students discover the links between the past and present through the garments and accessories in the exhibition Wearing our Identity - The First Peoples Collection.

Two options are offered, depending on the availability of rooms.

- Aboriginal artists introduce students to the legends, music and dance of their cultures.
- Students learn about the traditional knowledge of 2 First Peoples.



### ELEMENTARY CYCLE 3 | SECONDARY

#### INUIT - ANCESTRAL KNOWLEDGE 120 MINUTES

The rich and complex culture of Inuit has flourished for more than 4,000 years in the Canadian Arctic. Their carefully crafted tools and garments reveal their ingenuity and way of life in a harsh climate. Inuit draw on their ancestors' knowledge while continuing to evolve in the modern world. The shapes, designs and motifs used in their work reaffirm their ancestral beliefs.



In the workshop, students make a print inspired by Inuit engravings.



### WEARING OUR IDENTITY - MY ACTIVITY KIT

This activity kit will help you to further pursue the study of First Peoples in the classroom. The kit has teaching materials on Aboriginal ancestral knowledge as well as instructions and materials for three activities: beading a bracelet, designing a button blanket and a memory game.

### MILTON PARK: THE RESCUE OF A NEIGHBOURHOOD

120 MINUTES

SEPTEMBER TO NOVEMBER AND APRIL TO JUNE

Montreal changed dramatically during a surge of modernism in the 1970s. Neighbourhoods were transformed as old buildings were demolished to make way for concrete high rises. That was the destiny facing Milton Park and its rich architectural heritage before citizens mobilized to defend their neighbourhood and .living environment. This guided tour traces the history of Milton Park and raises awareness among young people about citizens' struggles to retain the city's human scale.





In a workshop, students put themselves in the shoes of an urban planner and design a ル development plan for a neighbourhood that would improve the lives of its inhabitants.

#### ELEMENTARY CYCLE 3 | SECONDARY

### THE GOLDEN SQUARE MILE, YESTERDAY AND TODAY

120 MINUTES

SEPTEMBER TO NOVEMBER AND APRIL TO JUNE

The McCord Museum is in the heart of the Golden Square Mile, where for 100 years the Montreal elite lived in a small patch of countryside that allowed them to escape the pollution of neighbourhoods near the port. Equipped with a tablet and accompanied by a guide, students tour the Golden Square Mile and the architectural styles of the 19th and 20th centuries. Along the way, they discover how the neighbourhood's magnificent buildings have been integrated into today's urban landscape.





In a workshop, students create a photomontage where the past and the present meet.

### **EDUCATION BEHIND THE SCENES** 120 MINUTES

During this activity, teachers and future teachers explore the educational potential of a school visit to the Museum. First, they become familiar with the museum, its collections and exhibitions. Then, accompanied by an interpreter-guide, they experience a tour and workshop normally offered to their students. This activity illustrates how the Museum can enrich social studies and citizenship programs.

A version of this activity aimed at **future recreation** professionals and child care providers is also offered.

### READING THROUGH ARCHIVES: TIME OF WAR, SEPARATION AND MIGRATION

#### **75 TO 90 MINUTES**

In times of war, men, women and children are confronted with experiences of separation and mourning. The First World War raged in Europe a century ago, and the impact was felt as far away as Montreal.

Still today, many people fleeing armed conflicts seek refuge in Montreal. What can we learn from past events?

An museum guide brings a multimedia production to your school and explores archival documents with the students. This educational activity revives the period from 1914 to 1918 in Montreal by looking at critical experiences in the lives of individuals.





In a workshop, students draw parallels with contemporary situations and think about ways they can be more welcoming to newcomers affected by war and loss.

### ELEMENTARY CYCLE 3 | SECONDARY

### FROM THE COUNTRY TO THE CITY: 1820 TO 1905

90 MINUTES

Who lived in the countryside surrounding Montreal in 1820? How did they live, and how did their children and grandchildren become citizens of Montreal around 1905?

Using images and objects from the educational collection, such as an iron and a cigar mould, students investigate and learn about demographic migration and the industrial development of their city. Their task is to link objects to the lives of figures from the period.

### LEARNING FRENCH AT THE McCORD MUSEUM
