
Grace Kelly evenings

A unique life

Muse of director Alfred Hitchcock and winner of a best actress Oscar for her remarkable performance in *The Country Girl*, Grace Kelly, who became Princess of Monaco upon her marriage on April 18, 1956, to Rainier III, Prince of Monaco, was the focus of attention and fascination throughout her life and had an enormous influence on women around the world.

With its spotlight on her personality, talent and values, *From Philadelphia to Monaco: Grace Kelly – Beyond the Icon*, a first for North America, will present the woman behind the celebrity and trace her extraordinary life journey through some 100 objects and archives dating from 1930 to 1970 and drawn from the Grimaldi Forum Monaco, Prince's Palace, Archives du Palais Princier de Monaco, and Audiovisual Archives of the Principality of Monaco:

testimonials, love letters, notes of friendship, photos, film clips and original film posters, and above all clothing and accessories, including some 40 dresses from designers who helped shape fashion history, such as Balenciaga, Chanel, Dior, and Yves Saint Laurent.

Also featured is the legendary "Kelly" handbag by Hermès, named in honour of Princess Grace and today an icon of the brand, her Oscar statuette (1955), and even the dress she wore to the Academy Awards ceremony. Audioguides will also be available to visitors, with 26 commentaries offering additional information about the life of Grace Kelly.

The exhibition is a journey mapped around such themes as the key to success, style, love, values, diplomacy, and her dedication to the Principality, because these aspects reveal the myriad facets of the character of this great woman, who devoted her life to her family, her people, and those close to her.

From Philadelphia to Monaco: Grace Kelly - Beyond the Icon is produced by the Grimaldi Forum Monaco in collaboration with the McCord Museum and based on an exhibition by the Victoria and Albert Museum in London.
