VIRTUAL PARTICIPATORY WORKSHOP

Length: 60 minutes

Target audience: Preschool – 1st cycle of Elementary school – School daycare services

Educational areas: Personal development (ethics and religion) – Arts

Brilliant, animated, and sometimes mischievous, the Trickster is a key figure in many cultures around the world, including Indigenous lore. Through a story and fun and dynamic activities, participants discover the Trickster archetype that broke established codes and left a surprising mark on our contemporary world.
